TEAM FROM SPOKANE, U.S.A.

For the first time, we had the honor of hosting a team of 22 from Redeemer Lutheran Church, Spokane, Washington State from the June 23 to the July 01. Wonderfully, their mission was to do a seed project (small scale ministry project meant to demonstrate God's love to people outside one's Church) in a school at Pai-Katanka, a community north east of Ghana. This school was started as a seed project to give hope and a future to the children of this community who were massively failing their junior high examinations. The team worked hard with pick axes and shovels with the people at the foundation of a building block. Surprisingly, even in the heavy rain the second day, the rural folks were amazed at the hard work that was exhibited by white people whom many think do not work in dirt. The impact was phenomenal and memorable, as they played, sang, danced with the children. Many of these people have never even seen a white person and for some, they spent hours just looking at them. On Sunday, each of the seven churches hosted some of the team members and in the afternoon, a soccer match between the people of Katanka and the US. It was unforgettable experience as the senior pastor of Redeemer became the coach and player at the same time and at a point in time, the US team had 16 players against 11 with male and females all mixed together. It was great fun but also good Seed project.

1. This community for years had never seen communal labor, but this event brought all the community together to work for 3 days before our arrival and two days with the team.
2. The two major soccer teams in the community had never played soccer match together: one Christian and one Moslem. Our soccer game brought them together with some of them playing for the US team and the other for the community. After the game, they were all hosted to a dinner and it was all excitement to the glory of God.
