



Monthly Report – November 2010

Training for youth of MESA Kodome

The youth's ordinary meeting of November was about their impression concerning the wholistic training. They suggest having two sessions a month instead of one. We revise physical aspect of the three relationships of man and started the social aspect. **Testimony:** *a father testified about the transformation of his son of 18 years old. He said that this son now started practicing cleanliness. He uses to wash his clothes, sweep his room and manage things in his room, what he didn't do before. The father is very happy about his son, and encourages us to continue the youth training meeting.*

Meeting with Church Leaders of Tohoun

We shared in that meeting, the necessity of wholistic ministry. According of their demand, we project a training program with them in next year. We invited them for Lome vision conference; but only one responded. Tohoun is a village border to Benin and located at 161 km from

Lome. God used us to bring urgently a Pastor's wife to a hospital distant of 58 km from Tohoum for an operation. Praise God, That woman went out of the hospital and is alive in good health today. Her husband continues to thank us. It was the Good Samaritan's story.

Vision casting for Pastors and Church Leaders of Atakpame

With Open Doors, I had again the opportunity to have a vision casting about the necessity of wholistic ministry for Church Leaders of Atakpame. This town is located at 165 km from Lome on the way going to north of Togo. We talked about the possibility of a vision conference in next year. They were 36 participants at this vision casting. They were invited for Lome vision conference on the following week; but three of them responded.
