



Monthly Report – July 2011

We thank our Lord Jesus Christ, the Master of Almighty God's vineyard, who sends us and uses us to accomplish His will according to His Father's plan. Here is how He led us during the month of July:

Youth's training. In July, we did as usual our ordinary Wholistic Development training meeting with youth of Amadahome and with youth of Kodome. We ended the topic **on Jesus, our Model of Growth and Service** with its application.

Bible study meeting. We still continued the bible study in groups with MESA Church. In each of the three French speaking groups and the three Ewe speaking groups, every facilitator ended the lesson about **The Image of God in BASICS II**. We also did general revision, questions and answers and application of the whole lesson of The Image of God.

Missionaries' training. We continued the training for missionaries who plants churches in villages and go for follow up during weekends. They are laymen and they sacrificed their weekends and holidays for the mission in villages. We started the lesson on ABC's of Culture in July program.

Conference of Tsevie. We did three days conference for Church Leaders in partnership with Open Doors at Tsevie, a town located at 35 km from Lomé. The conference gathered 80 Pastors, Elders, Deacons and some youth from 16 various Denominations. At the end of the conference, all participants were satisfied and testified their gratitude to God and to us, the organizers, because the conference helped them a lot. Also, each local church leader elaborated an application planning to allow him to practice the conference teachings.

Widows' training. To help some widows to be independent financially, Harvest Togo in partnership with Open Doors Cameroon, trained ten (10) widows to do some small trade which will allow them to generate income. The training took three days; and concerned how to apply biblical principles of transformation. The widows are from six different local churches. At the end of the training, each widow received 50 000 F CFA (about 105\$ USA). The training had been done by Harvest, represented by John ATIVI, and the financing had been done by Open Doors, represented by Mrs. Helene NSIN OUM. All activities were coordinated by me, Happy AZIADEKEY, Harvest representative in Togo. The widows were very touched by God's love we demonstrated to them; and were very happy because they knew now how to take care of their business as Christian and how to economize and start other commerce with his economy.
