Tesano Baptist Church

A one day Training and re-equipping of cell leaders of Tesano Baptist Church came on. Instead of a number of over hundred, about 35 attended due to conflict of programs. This Church has adopted our BASIC books as their main materials for their cell meetings and we had a good time sharing insights with the few that attended. They promised to be better facilitators of the wholistic gospel.

Training @ Good Samaritan International I School, Katanka.

Training of teachers and children of the Good Samaritan International School was very successful. The teachers deeply appreciated the teaching since they said 'they now have a better understanding of the value and dignity of children.' The children in their evaluation said, now they know that they are special and unique since they are created in the image and likeness of God. They also now understand the mandate that God has given to man-to control, dominate and be stewards of His creation. Many of parents of these children are idol worshippers, three went home and boldly advised their parents to stop idol worship, almost all the children at the weekend confessed that they helped their parents in their farms and homes. Two girls said they helped two old ladies with their farm loads after school, two boys invited their friends to church on Sunday and three girls have started planting flowers in their homes. Transformation has started and we pray that we can be consistent to make this an annual school training program.

Story: According to Madam Mary Pinkrah of Cape Coast, she gave seed money of GHC16 to a woman who was asked by her landlord to vacate her shop from where she is selling since it was closed for a long time. She was asked to remove it if she doesn't operate the shop by the close of June 2011. With tears running down her cheeks she approached Mrs. Pinkrah for assistance. She offered to help her with GHC16 since that was all she had at that time and encouraged her to start petty trading with the money. She visited her often to advise her on how to manage her business and then provides clothing for the woman and her kids. By the close of August 2011, the said woman told Mrs. Pinkrah that she had saved GHC 100 as profit from the business she started with her capital. Currently, she can take good care of her children-pay their school fees, feed them, pay water and power bills. This lady is now part of the wholistic club in the suburb of Cape Coast. To God be the glory! The group members of Mrs. Pinkrah also do gathered some clothing's, toiletries and confectionaries and donated it to an Orphanage in their community.
