Little earthquake story about St. Simon family

My wife and I were in Paris from January 11 to 26. We left Haiti on January 11 and arrive in

Paris January 12 in the morning, and the earthquake happens January 12 in the afternoon.



This is an empty land in the community where all people refuge after the EQ.

I cannot imagine how God loves me and work to put me in a secure area at that time. My nephew who lives in Paris calls us early on Wednesday to say there is an earthquake in Haiti. We wake up and begin to follow news on TV to see what happen. It was a very difficult time for me especially for my wife. Let me say that I had two tragedies to manage, the first one is the earthquake in Haiti, we need to know about the children and other people home, about the house, the church. Who is died, who is a live and what I need to do? The second one is my wife in Paris. She is very sad and cries a lot, took a lot and wants to leave Paris in the first next air plane to Haiti. No air plane can land in Port-au-Prince and I had also my health condition to manage. It was a very difficult time for me, but God helps me to face the situation.

We talk with the children they well but sleep in the street in difficult condition.

Harvest, in their big concern for my family and victim's people in Haiti coordinate some relief activities to bring help to give assistance in Haiti in partnership with cosecha in the D, R. I was agreed with the team to take my children to go to the D, R, with them until I leave France. It was a big relief for us. Praise the Lord.

We left Paris January 26 to go to Dominican Republic to meet the children it was a big ouff.

We spent about one month in the D,R, and we go back in our country to continue to work. We spent four month in the yard of a colleague pastor and slept under tent but now by the grace of the Lord we are not under tent but we return home.

1. Distribution tents and food

In the first time, the biggest need was tent and food because many people slept in

the street the government and the international communities don't have enough tents to distribute to people and the distribution of the food was very complex so many people were in a bad situation. We made a little team to build tents and to distribute some money that people can buy food; sixty families were beneficiated of those distributions.

2. Give money to people for a small business



Many victims' people used

to do a small business in the street before the earthquake and they lost all things during the catastrophe. We met with some of them encourage them and give them some money to restart their little business.
