Likewise *Madan Shah* facilitated sessions on Luke 2:42, God's Intentions, Seed Project & Seed Project Planning. We had a good chemistry as we served together as a team. At the end of every vision conferences, we evaluated each other and provided feedbacks to become better facilitators. We never had such experience for conducting series of VCs in a short of period of time covering almost nationwide. Although we had hard times in traveling, we enjoyed wide range of cultures, languages, and foods 😊

Most of participant expressed that God has changed their hearts through the conference and preparing them for making a difference in the community through practicing what they learned. A lady shared that she never learned that her little act of service to needy one can be a great ministry to God and bringforth a great multiplication. Pastor and leaders from every churches worked out for seed projects and expressed their commitments for practicing biblical wholism starting with the plan they made at the end of the conference.
